SPEAKERS

Richard Brockington.

Having retired from the legal profession, Richard researched and wrote about three townships – Renwick, Kirkoswald and Staffield – in north-eastern Cumbria. He has now combined these into a single publication which will appear as a 'VCH Short' during the course of this year. He served as Chairman of the CLHF 2006-10, and has represented the Federation on the Cumbria County History Trust since its foundation in 2009.

Jane Penman

Jane is a classicist by training and, before retiring to the family home in Martindale in 2008, taught Classics at Wycombe Abbey School in Buckinghamshire. She saw in the VCH Project an opportunity to research the history of Martindale as one of a group of local historians engaged, under guidance, in similar projects. In seeking to understand a remote community she has found the work of archaeologists enlightening, but she still finds palaeography challenging.

Jane Platt

Jane is a historian of 19th-century English religious history. Among her many publications are Subscribing to Faith: The Anglican Parish Magazine, 1859-1929 (Palgrave Macmillan, 2015) and, as editor, The Diocese of Carlisle 1814-55, Chancellor Walter Fletcher's Diocesan Book (Surtees Society & CWAAS, 2015). She is also one of the editors of CWAAS Transactions. She is currently working on Thomas Machell's notes for his unpublished history of Westmorland.

Bill Shannon

Bill is an independent researcher, specialising in cartographic and landscape history in the early modern period. He is currently Treasurer and Vice-President of CWAAS, and a Trustee of the Cumbria County History Trust.
