

### **Outing to Burneside**

Last summer, VCH volunteers enjoyed a walk around the village of Lazonby to look at ways of approaching the landscape and settlement section of a VCH article. Earlier this month, we repeated the exercise, this time choosing to visit Burneside in the south of the county. Ten VCH drafters were joined by members of the Burneside Local History Group on a guided walk around the village, led by Angus Winchester.

Starting in the church room at St Oswald's, the group were given several maps from different periods to consider how the village had developed. After lunch we headed into the village, armed with the maps - and our waterproofs!

Our route took in the paper mill, which dominates the village, and which has expanded significantly since the mid nineteenth century.



We also looked at Burneside Hall, the Bryce Institute and various housing developments, including the sixteen homes built in memory of Charles and Edith Cropper. Our particular thanks go to John and Sue Sheils for helping to organise the visit. The tea and cakes were very welcome!

#### **Supporting VCH Volunteers**
