AIKTON

Earthworks: The Castle, Downhall; a moated manor-house (R. S. Ferguson, O.S. vi, 194; T. H. B. Graham, N.S. X, 112; Curwen, *Castles*, 44). Part of old drawbridge found 1826 (Whellan 201).

Church:

- (a) St. Andrew's, anciently St. Michael's; chancel-arch early 12th cent.; aisle arcade 13th or 14th cent.; much restored 1732, 1792, 1869 (Dr. H. Barnes, N.S. xiii, 267). Graveslab, 13th cent. Two bells, perhaps 14th cent. Brass to W. Lindsey, rector, 1753.
- (b) Rectory built 1828, called "Aikton Hall" (T. H. Hodgson, N.S.xiii, 272).

Wells

- (a) Fairy Well, 250 yds. E. of Aikton post office.
- (b) Spa well, N.E. of Inn ,Biglands
