## BECKERMET ST. JOHN'S.

## Motte:

- (a) "Carnarvon Castle " or " Coneygarth cop," mound and bailey of the Flemings (C. A. Parker, N.S. iii, 214).
- (b) ? Wotobank or Wodowbank cop (Curwen, Castles, 38).
- Viking Age: nine 10th and 11th cent. stones at the church; one built in (invisible) at Croft House (W. G. C. in Calverley, Crosses, 34)
- *Church*, St. John's; E.E. fragments; 13th cent.? door reinserted. Rebuilt 1810, 1878. Graveslab of a Fleming. PreReformation font.
- Site of St. Thomas' cross, 550 yds. S. of Egremont bridge; traditionally the corpse-rest on the old road from Hale and Wilton and on the main road northwards (C. A. Parker, N.S. ix, 96).
