CARLATTON

Tumulus; ¼ m. E.N.E. of Carlatton farm. Bronze arrowheads found 70 yds. to N.E. of tumulus in 1854 (Ordnance map; T. H.B. Graham, N.S. XX, 27).

Site of old church,

- (a) S. of Carlatton farm (R. S. Ferguson, O.S.iv, 252).
- (b) Graveslabs at the farm; one of Henry de Newton, presented to the living 1330; one, over barn door, of ?Robt. de London, 1320 (R. S. Ferguson, O.S. iv, 252).
- *Old road:* "Brampton Street " leading to Brampton from the south (Bounder of 1613; N.S. xx, 25)
- Old dykes: "in Brampton streitte unto the double dykes next to Carlatton . . . to an old dyke adjoining upon the head dyke of Castlecarrock . . . to the head dyke of Brakanthwait; to the head dyke of Albyfield . . . to the head dyke of Cumrew to the river Carne." (ibid.)
