ORTON

- Roman: The "Cardewlees" altar (E. E. ix, 1224) found 200 yds. N.W. of New Inn, now at Carlisle Museum (O.S. xv, 45)
- *Church:* St. Kentigern's, anciently St. Giles'; early 12th and 13th cent., restored 1886. Part of an E.E. font, found 1886. Two fragments of graveslabs and part of 12th or 13th cent. cross. Bell 1753.
- Defensive: Great Orton dyke, site of Barras gate ½ m. N. of village; near it, part of rampart, 8 to 12ft. wide, remaining (Curwen, Castles, 196).

Site: of Bow stone (see Kirkandrews-on-Eden) ¼ m. E.S.E. of Bow.

Finds:

- (a) Celt, 1879, ½ m. S.S.E. of church.
- (b) Stone tassel, mediæval, at Little Orton, now in Carlisle Museum (L. E. Hope, N.S. vi, 302).
