- (a) Burton, mentioned 1120-30 (Farrer, *Kendale ii*, 142).Late pre-Norman cross-head, shaft and two fragments (W.G.C. in Calverley, *Crosses*, 89). Two piscinae (o.s. xii, 210). Old font. Preston chapel, ? 1634; Dalton chapel, ? 1636. Church altered 1844, restored 1872 (J. Chalmers, o.s. xiii, 64). St. Helen's well (N. & B. i, 235).
- (b) Holme, Holy Trinity, 1839
