LOWESWATER

Two tumuli: Carling Knott summit (J. C. Ward, O.S. iii 247) .

Pit circle ? ¼ m. N.N.E. of Flouteren tarn.

Moat: Peel, S. side of house, at foot of Crummock water (*ibid.*) ; moated manorhouse of the Lindsays ? (Curwen, *Castles*, 45).

Church: now St. Bartholomew's; 14th cent. bell at Keswick. Rebuilt 1827, near site of earlier chapel. Restored 1884.

Well: St. Ringan's, Fang's brow, medicinal (W. Dickinson, O.S. vi, 188) , now drinking-troughs.

Old lead mines, ⅓ m. S. of High nook.

Find : Stone hammer, 1868, ¼ m. S. of E. from point 1668 ft on Melbreak
