FARLAM AND MIDGEHOLME

Tumuli:

- (a) *E.* of Hallbankgate (G. R. Hall, O.S. vi, 480).
- (b) Greenlea Cross, $\frac{1}{4}$ m. N.W. of Forest head (*ibid.*)
- (c) Howgill, S.W. of Tindal tarn (*ibid.*, 469.) $\frac{1}{2}$ m. E.N.E. of Farlam; urn found 1880 (Ordnance map).
- (d) Cold Fell (Maughan, A. J. xi, 11 ; Jenkinson, *Guide*, ID)).

Site of church, founded 12th cent., afterwards dedicated to St.Thomas of Canterbury; demolished 1859, and present church built on the hill above, 1859-60.

Stonehouses:

- (a) remains of lower storey of 15th or 16th cent. In gardener's cottage at Farlam Hall (H. Penfold in *Castles*, 410) .
- (b) Tindale tarn house, tower c. 20 ft. sq., remains (*ibid.*)

Old Road:

Carnetley-Moss Hill-Park-Forest head (G. Rome Hall, O.S. vi, 480).

Old coal-mine, mentioned in the Survey of Gilsland, 1589; old mines and spelter-works disused.

Spa: Priordike, $\frac{1}{2}$ m. W.N.W. of Midgeholme.
