### MORLAND

#### *Tumuli:*

- (a) Windrigg hill, 1m. E. of Gunnerkeld (O.M.).
- (b) Sleagill, interments, " two skeletons with brazen rings on their arms " (Hodgson, *Westmd.*, 143).

*Roman road*, track through Sleagill and Ironshaw, to W. of Mealy sike (P. Ross, N.S. xx, II).

#### *Church,*

- (a) existing c. 1100 (Prescott, *Wetherhal*, 371) ; St.Laurence's (Dr. H. Todd, quoted N. & B. i, 443). Tower, late 11th-12th cent. Quire and transepts 13th cent. Four piers of S. arcade of nave, *temp.* Edward I. Chancel debased Tudor. Restorations 1759, 1896. Graveslab, c. 1250 and fragment (N.s. ix,2). Carved wood of quire-stalls c. 1500. Brass, 1562, palimpsest of c. 1520 (o.s. xiii, 149). Altar, rails and almsbox, 1633-45. Mural paintings (o.s. xv, 19). Stoup or trough (N.s. xx, 245; xxi, 274).
- (b) Chapel of St. Mary in le Wyth, site at Chapel Garth, Kempley; mentioned 1405 (Prescott, *Wetherhal*, 43, 414)

#### *Domestic :*

- (a) Newby Hall, of Nevinsons; Jacobean, restored 1685;
- (b) old Tithe-house (R. Morton Rigg, N.S. xii, 121).

*Road*, early 13th cent.; Bampton-Shapbeckgate-GunnerkeldSleagill-Littlebeck-Colby-Appleby (N.s. ix, 245).

*Find*: Stone hammer (*Proc. S.A.*, N.S. viii, 492).
