ORMSIDE

Tumulus at the church; cist and skeletons (N.s. xxiii, 278).

Anglian and Viking Age:

(a) The Ormside Cup, 8th ? cent., found in churchyard 1823, now in York Phil. Soc. Museum (W. G. C., o.s. xv, 381).

(b) Weapons found in churchyard, now in Carlisle Museum (R. S. Ferguson, o.s. xv, 377).

Church, St. James'. Original fabric and tower c. 1110. N. aisle added, chancel lengthened, with squint, 12th cent. Windows of 14th and 15th cent. Piscinae (o.s. xii, 209). Graveslab and fragment (Bower, N.S. Vii, 171). Stoup or mortar (N.s. xxi, 275). Churchyard cross, restored. Old yew. Moot cross, restored. (Rev. J. Brunskill, N.S. i, 155; D. Scott, N.S. xxiii, 278).

Tower, 14th cent., Ormside Hall, of the Bartons (Curwen, *Castles*, 310).

Other finds: 17th cent. pewter and copper vessels, 1689, in churchyard (N. & B. i, 517)
