LAZONBY AND PLUMPTON WALL

Earthworks:

(a) "Camp," $\frac{1}{3}$ m. E. of Pears Gill. "Fort," $\frac{2}{3}$ m. E. of Pears Gill (Ordnance map).

(b) Castlerigg fort, ruins with moat (Jefferson, *Leath Ward*, 463).

Roman :

(a) fort, Castlesteads, VOREDA (F. Haverfield, N.S. xiii, 177) ; 32 Roman stones from the site (*ibid.* 183-198) and 3rd cent. Hoard of coins found at Scratchmerescar (*ibid.* 197, 405).

(b) Road on line of present highroad, Penrith to Carlisle.

Church:

(a) St. Nicholas', rebuilt 1865 ; 3 graveslabs, one with a double cross; churchyard cross (W. G. Collingwood in Calverley, *Crosses*, 227).

(b) Plumpton Wall church, St. John Evangelist, built 1767.

(c) Meetinghouse, 1709, originally Presbyterian, now Wesleyan (Rev. J. H. Colligan, N.S. viii, 43).

Domestic : Fairbank, early 17th cent. stone, Musgrave arms, re-inserted (G. Watson, O.S. xv, 85).

Sites :

(a) Tarn Wadling, between Nunclose and High Heskett.

(b) " Sampson's Cave " or " Giant's Chamber," $\frac{2}{3}$ m. W.S.W. of Nunnery (Jefferson, *Leath Ward*, 463).

Finds

(a) Urns with bones and ashes, found on Lazonby fell c. 1780 (*ibid.*)

(b) Stone axe 1897;

(c) Flint arrowheads 1873, 1875, gym. E. of VOREDA
