CAMERTON AND SEATON

Roman fort, "Burrow walls," N. of the Derwent, near Workington. Roman coins and pottery found 1852; also altar (C.I.L. vii, 361) now at Lowther castle, and four others now lost. Later building on this site, ? Norman (Whellan, 464; W. Dickinson, O.S. v, 22; R. S. Ferguson, O.S. xvi, 51).

Church, now St. Peter's, rebuilt 1694 and 1796; W. tower 1855; restoration 1892. Effigy of "Black Tom" [Curwen], 1510.

Pele tower site: Camerton Hall (Curwen, Castles, 262).

Finds:

- (a) Bronze palstave, found c. 1870, and net-sinker c. 1900, at Seaton, now in Carlisle Museum (J. R. Mason, N.S. xxii, 459).
- (b) Viking sword, found 1901-2 67 yds. S. of West Seaton vicarage (Rev. C. T. Phillips, N.S. iv, 335)
