

Ancient Monuments in this township

1923 List

SKELTON

Tumulus: "Loaden how," $\frac{3}{4}$ m. W. of the Laithes house; opened c. 1775.. Two urns in cist, in one, burnt bones; in the other a large skull (Jefferson, *Leath Ward*, 165).

Church:

- (a) St. Michael's; tower mainly 15th cent; a little old work in body; restored 1794, 1879.
- (b) Ancient chapel, site, S. of Lamonby Hall.

Pele-tower:

- (a) Hardrigg Hall had a large square tower in 1840 (Jefferson, *Leath Ward*, 164) ;
- (b) house of Southaikes to c. 1600.

Domestic:

- (a) Lamonby Hall, of Seatons; in 1680 of Wilkinsons.
- (b) Scales Hall, formerly of Broughams (*ibid.* 165)
