## CARTMEL AND (UPPER) HOLKER

*Cist and urn*, near Cartmel new cemetery, found *c*. 1812 (Stockdale, *Annales Caermoelenses*, 251).

Hill fort? Howbarrow (Stockdale, op. cit. 254).

"Cairns" near Howbarrow (*ibid.*). Cairns and stone ring rampart 150 yards circumference on Holker Bank; the "Toadstone," mentioned by Stockdale was the last remnant of standing stones; the rest removed *c.* 1798 (*ibid.*).

Hut-Circles on Pit farm allotment, Hampsfell (H. F. Rigge, o.s. viii, 265).

Site of ramparted enclosure in Walton, *i.e.* W. part of Cartmel town (Stockdale, *op. cit.* 253; see also N.S. XXiV, 291)

*Priory church* of St. Mary the Virgin; St. Michael's church was earlier than the Augustinian priory founded 1189-94. (Farrer, Lancs. Chartulary, 341). Quire, lower part of tower, N. quire aisle, S. doorway and transepts are Trans. and E.E. S. aisle enlarged 14th cent. Nave rebuilt, belfry added, great E. window etc. 15<sup>th</sup> cent. Repairs 1597, 1613; restorations 1618-23 and 1849-67 (W. O. Roper, o.s. xiii, 293; J. F. Curwen, N.S. xx, 106). Graveslabs:—prior Wm. de Walton, i4th cent.; prior Wm. Br—; and three others. Effigies of knight and lady, 13th cent.; and of an Augustinian canon. " Harrington tomb "composed c. 1620 of various monuments (Canon Bower, o.s. xv, 428; H. Gaythorpe, Furness Lore, 91; B.N.F.C., 1902-4, 148; J. Brownbill, N.S. xxv, 373). Canons' seats 14th-15th cent. Canopies of stalls and screens 1620. Ancient glass in E. window and in E. window of the Town quire. Font re-cut. Many 17th cent. monuments. Brass of Briggs, 1703. Old books and relics in vestry. Mural . paintings (o.s. xv, 15). Piscinae (o.s. xii, 211). Sundial 1727. Four bells; two of 1661, the others of 1726 and 1729 (F. C. Cheetham, Trans. Lane. and C. Soc. xl). Base of churchyard cross. The gatehouse refitted in 1923 and vested in the National Trust. " Headless Cross " S. of town. Cross in Market place.

- (a) Holker Hall, of Prestons *c.* 1600; rebuilt by the Duke of Devonshire after fire of 1871 (Stockdale, *op. cit.* 409-432).
- (b) Bigland Hall, of Biglands 16th cent.; fireplace inscribed "I B M B / N G " misread as " 1167" (H. Gaythorpe, B.N.F.C. xvii, 43).
- (c) Frith Hall, of Prestons, remains in outhouse (Stockdale, op. cit. 511).

Beacon, 1m. E. of Priory (o.s. xiv, 143).

Old roads in 1800. See Stockdale (op. cit. 370.)

Old iron-works: Low-wood, 1766 (o.s. xv, 222).
